FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I hope all the EVPPS Mothers, Grandmothers and Female role models in our community enjoyed Mother's Day last weekend. We often take for granted the people who love us the most that's why Mother's Day is an opportune time to spoil and celebrate the important female influences in our lives. Well done to the P&C for their Mother's Day cake stall raising almost \$500 in an afternoon. Thank you to all the families who donated the scrumptious cakes for sale.

In 2018 East Victoria Park Primary School will be conducting NAPLAN Online, which means moving NAPLAN from current paper-based tests to computer-based assessments. Year 3 students will undertake online assessments for numeracy, reading and language conventions but will do a paper-based NAPLAN writing test. Year 5 students will undertake all NAPLAN content areas (including writing) online.

We are currently half way through the Online NAPLAN assessments completing the Writing and Reading this week with Language Conventions and Numeracy to be held next week. Having been administering these tests to year 3 & 5 students, I'm very proud of the effort shown by them and the commitment to engage with the online test material. All going well the NAPLAN Online should produce student reports sooner. This is good news for the teachers as we can use the data to balance against teacher judgement of student achievement.

The draft PBS matrix outlining our expected behaviours has begun to take shape, as a result of community, staff and student consultation. We are using **CORE** as our expected behaviour acronym which stands for **Care, Organised, Respect and Engaged**. We are now identifying what expected behaviours can be taught within Our School Community, Our Learning Areas, Our Playground and Our Undercover Area. This week we have explicitly targeted 'Organised in the playground' - *we return to class and line up before the second siren at recess and lunch*. Thank you to Jackie Bisley for being our parent representative on the PBS committee; her perspective has been invaluable throughout this process.

I will be accessing the balance of my Long Service Leave this term on Fridays. This means Mr Ranford will be assisting Mrs Brewer in the office on those days. I thank them for seamless leadership shown in my absence.

Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

East Victoria Park Primary is currently in the early phases of implementing a new program (PBS) to improve behavioural and academic outcomes in the classroom, school and community.

What is PBS?

PBS **builds a continuum of supports for staff and students**. At each level (or tier) there is an emphasis on **outcomes** in the form of agreed expectations for student and staff behaviour, and **data** to guide decision-making about what **practices** should be put in place to support student learning and social behaviour.

Why do we need PBS?

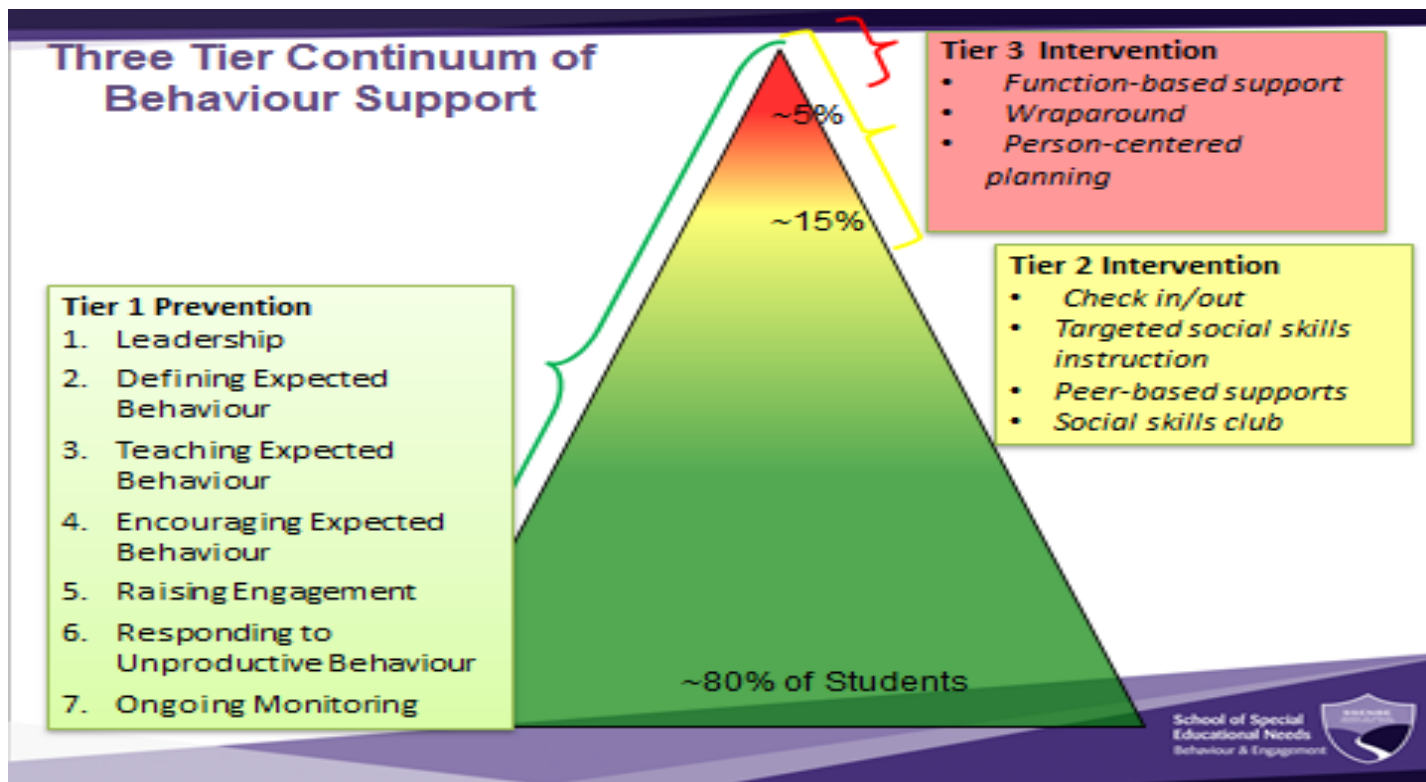
- A consistent approach of expectations for academic and behaviour success within the classroom, school and community.
- Implement a uniform approach to dealing with behaviours.
- Improving school outcomes.

Improving student academic and behaviour outcomes is about ensuring all students have access to the most effective and accurately implemented instructional and behavioural practices and interventions possible. PBS provides an operational framework for achieving these outcomes.
