FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Another busy semester one has passed us by as we reach term 2, week 9; a shorter term than normal. We had NAPLAN online, winter carnivals, NAIDOC activities, school photos and the reward morning tea for the EVPPS stars. We also launched our Positive Behaviour School (PBS) initiative outlining our expected behaviours of Care, Organised, Respect, Engaged and sought community feedback on the behaviour matrix. A big thank you to the members of our community who took the time to provide feedback on the matrix, the PBS committee found this feedback very useful.

This semester we also emailed student reports home for the first time. The Kindy reports were a real hit with parents as they received the new electronic portfolio report. We currently have only 30 students whose families haven't opened their reports via email. If you haven't received an email with the report link please ring the front office to check the email address we have on file. A big tip for parents opening the report link is to save the document to file as the report link is only active for 4 weeks. Please read the report with your child sharing and celebrating their achievements and progress and make an appointment to speak with your child's teacher if you need to discuss any aspect of the report.

This week we have been trialing flipping our recess and lunch eating times to after play instead of before play. As was explained to the students the reason for the change was three fold; 1. Limiting the amount of food thrown away due to students rushing to go and play 2. Our eating area will be left much cleaner due to increase supervision when students are dismissed from the eating area and 3. Playground disputes can be resolved during eating time with duty teachers so that playground issues don't flow on into the classroom, using up valuable learning time. It's early days into the trial and already one switched on student said to me that 'This flipped recess and lunch is great, we actually get more play time, because sometimes we get kept in the undercover area when we're too noisy.' Another positive outcome has been the eating time is much quieter due to students eating rather than rushing their food to go and play. The trial will go for this week and the first week back next term, when we will survey the student's thoughts about continuing the flipped eating times.

The first day back for students next term will be TUESDAY 17th JULY.

On the Monday school development day (student free day) all the staff will be attending the biennial Curtin Education Network conference at Curtin University. The theme of the professional learning day is Leading 2 Learn with keynote speaker Gavin Grift, speaking about cognitive coaching, through quality teacher practice.

I wish everyone a safe holiday period and look forward to seeing everyone back on the 17th July.

ASSEMBLY

Thank you to Room 5 for hosting today's assembly. It was based on their inquiry investigation on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island culture. The students performed the story of Tiddalik the Frog who drank all the water. A very moving video was shown based on the NAIDOC theme "Because of her we can", where the Aboriginal students in the school explained who and why their female hero is.

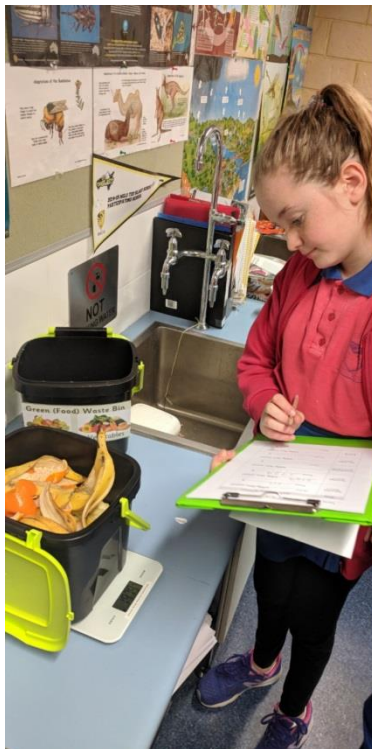

The EVPPS Waste-Wise Warrior Committee is officially up and running! The aim of the committee is to raise awareness about sustainability and get students actively involved in waste reduction strategies at EVPPS. Our first waste-wise initiative is to help reduce the amount of food waste being sent to landfill. The newly selected waste-wise warriors from Rooms 5 to 10 collect all fruit and vegetable scraps produced by students during recess and lunch then empty the waste into the Junior garden compost bin. In the past two weeks we've already saved over 10kg of food waste from landfill...imagine how much we'll save in a year!! The nutrient rich compost will then be used to help grow our Junior Garden plants.

Friday 20 July is an important date in your child's education.

You need to apply to enrol your children in a public school for 2019 if they are:

- starting Kindergarten – 4 years old by 30 June 2019
- starting Pre-primary (first year of compulsory school) – 5 years old by 30 June 2019
- starting Year 7 (first year of secondary school)
- changing schools.

Reminder! STUDENTS LEAVING SCHOOL GROUNDS

Children are not permitted to leave school grounds during school times unless collected by a parent / guardian or emergency contact, the details which have been provided earlier. Persons collecting children during the day are required to go to the office first to sign the child out before collecting them from the classroom. They will be issued a leave pass which is to be given to the teacher prior to collecting the child. Photo identification may sometimes be requested.

Please note, if parents arrange for alternative family / friends to pick up their child during school times, the school will need to be informed of this arrangement prior.
